PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR BCG INSTILLATION

BCG INSTILLATION INTO THE BLADDER

You are about to receive a medication called Bacillus Calmette-Guerin (BCG), which is a type of immunotherapy for bladder cancer. You will get this medication by inserting a catheter into the bladder. After the catheter is in the bladder, the BCG will be pushed through the catheter with a syringe into the bladder. This is a bladder instillation.

You will receive this treatment once a week for _____ weeks.

AFTER BCG INSTILLATION

You need to hold the BCG in your bladder for 2 hours. After the 2 hours, you should sit on the toilet to urinate (to prevent splatters) and fully empty your bladder. After you urinate, pour 1 cup of bleach into the toilet and let it sit there for 15 minutes before flushing. You need to repeat this for 6 hours after the first urination. Drink plenty of fluids on your treatment day to flush out your bladder.

POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS

Flu-like symptoms Burning with urination Urinary Urgency Frequency of urination Blood or blood clots in the urine Joint Pain Coughing Skin rash Fever (101 and above) Chills Feeling tired

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Flu, Pneumonia and COVID vaccines must not be received until two weeks after completion of treatment and at least one week prior to beginning treatment.

TREATMENT SCHEDULE

Time Zero:	BCG weekly x 6 weeks
Month #3:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy); if normal, BCG weekly x 3 weeks
Month #6:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy); if normal, BCG weekly x 3 weeks
Month #9:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy)
Month #12:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy); if normal, BCG weekly x 3 weeks
Month #15:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy)
Month #18:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy); if normal, BCG weekly x 3 weeks
Month #21:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy)
Month #24:	Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy); if normal, BCG weekly x 3 weeks

After month #24: Cystoscopy (with possible biopsy) every 6-12 months
